## Blues Review: Nikki Jones Band

### Live at Wave-length Studio

The blues has always lived at the intersection of tradition and transformation. From the back porches of the Mississippi Delta to the electric streets of Chicago, each new generation reshapes its contours while keeping the genre's heart intact. With their latest live album, the Nikki Jones Band again proves that the blues still has new stories to tell — and entirely new grooves to explore.

Nikki and Brandon are an amazing musical power couple as they fell for each

other between verses, their love humming soft and low beneath every melody. Onstage, each glance and guitar slide felt like a secret vow set to rhythm and smoke.

Led by powerhouse vocalist Nikki Jones, whose commanding presence recalls legends like Etta James and Koko Taylor while sounding unmistakably modern, the band has crafted a record that's both grounded and groundbreaking. Featuring the band's guitarist and Nikki's partner on and off stage Brandon Logan's legendary guitar work, Loren Christian's explosive drumming, and Kevin

Kelley's fluid bass lines, the album delivers musicianship of the highest order. What sets it apart, outside of it being recorded live, is the group's fearless ambition: intricate time signatures, daring arrangements, and a joyous sense of discovery that redefines what contemporary blues can be.

Nikki Jones possesses the kind of voice that arrests a crowd before the first chorus lands. Her range isn't just technical — it's emotional. She can stretch a single syllable into a story, then pivot from a sultry whisper to a triumphant wail with effortless control. Every phrase feels

deliberate, every inflection earned. Jones doesn't imitate the masters — she converses with them, channeling a century of blues lineage into a sound as vital as it is timeless.

She approaches each lyric like a seasoned storyteller, embedding the songs with lived experience. Whether she's delving into heartbreak or resilience, there's an emotional precision that makes her performances impossible to ignore.

Brandon Logan's guitar work and vocals could easily anchor a record on its own. His playing is muscular yet lyrical, drawing ▶


more than 100%. I am excited to see what new opportunities and adventures await us in 2026. I'd also like to personally thank the CBA


membership. Your collective interaction and support, both financial and others, along with our shared passion for the blues, is what empowers

▶ from the classic blues lexicon while pushing it into uncharted terrain. The tone — rich, vocal, and soulful — evokes the spirit of vintage tube amps and smoky bars, yet his phrasing feels thoroughly modern.

On several tracks, Logan delivers solos that unfold like narratives in miniature: clean, deliberate openings that build into cascades of bends and slides before resolving with surgical precision. His intertwining lines with Jones's vocals create moments of electricity — their musical dialogue feels almost telepathic, a push-and-pull that animates the entire record.

The secret engine behind the band's innovation lies in the rhythm section.

Drummer Loren and bassist Kevin approach the blues not as a fixed form, but as a constantly shifting landscape. Loren plays with orchestral imagination, moving between traditional shuffles and dizzying meters that inject the music with tension and surprise. His touch — crisp cymbals, resonant toms, a sense of swing that seems to breathe — keeps the music alive and unpredictable.

Kevin, meanwhile, anchors the group with a melodic sensibility rare for blues bassists. His lines dance around the beat, adding motion and dimension without disrupting the pocket.

One of the album's most daring creative choices lies in its re-imagining

of classic blues standard "Slipback" by Marcus King. Instead of paying static tribute, the Nikki Jones Band turns the songs inside out — slowing tempos here, shifting keys there, adding rhythmic accents that reveal emotional layers buried in the originals. The band never drifts into pastiche; instead, they honor the emotional gravity of the old songs while re-contextualizing them for a generation raised on eclectic playlists and genre-blending. The result is music that feels at once steeped in history and startlingly current.

What elevates their second album beyond technical brilliance is its emotional scope. The Nikki Jones Band explores the full spectrum of the human condition — heartbreak, joy, defiance, and grace — without getting trapped by genre conventions. One track might pulse with the kinetic energy of funk; another might simmer with gospel reverence. Yet each song remains unmistakably blues at its core.

Nikki's lyrical phrasing often subverts expectation. She doesn't dwell on sorrow — she transforms it. Even when confronting pain, there's an assertion of agency in her delivery. It's the blues as catharsis, not tragedy.

Taken as a whole, the album feels like a live

statement of purpose. It declares that the blues isn't a museum piece — it's a living language, rich enough to absorb the complexities of the present. In the hands of these players, it becomes a vessel for both virtuosity and vulnerability. All recorded live as a band in a studio setting.




Brandon redefines the possibilities of guitar tone and phrasing. Loren and Kevin forge one of the tightest rhythm sections in recent memory. And Nikki Jones, standing center stage, carries the emotional truth of the blues forward with conviction and grace.


It's no exaggeration to say this album marks a turning point. For purists, it honors the old forms with technical mastery. For modern listeners, it opens doors to rhythmic and harmonic worlds rarely explored in the genre. Most importantly, it pulses with life — the unmistakable sound of musicians not preserving tradition but expanding it.

The Nikki Jones Band has not only made one of the year's finest albums — they've redefined what the blues can sound like in this century. ■




## Blues Review: Hard Road

In the summer of 2015, blues fans at the Waterfront Blues Festival in Portland were in for a treat- the introduction to a fifteen-year-old wunderkind named Christone "Kingfish" Ingram. His already emerging talents wowed the crowd, with voice and guitar playing skills that belied his young age.

Over the past decade Kingfish has toured almost constantly and released one live album and three studio albums. His fans were thrilled when his 2021 release, "662", was awarded a Grammy Award for Best Contemporary Blues Album. He also founded his own record company,



Red Zero Records, in partnership with Exceleration Music.

His most recent release, "Hard Road", is the result of the maturation of his musical fluency combined with his life experiences. He is reunited with his Grammy-winning producer and co-songwriter, Tom Hambridge. The opening song, "Truth", connects his storytelling with confident vocals and a searing guitar. In the important second verse, he states his truth. "Some call it blues, some say it's rock n roll; I don't know what it is, it all comes from the soul; People love to talk and throw around the bull; I

don't care what you call it, long as it feels good". Kingfish has learned the lessons of his roots and now he declares his independence and freedom to create his art in his own way. He has matured into an artist who uses his growing life experience as his canvas to paint his own pictures.

On the outstanding track, "Bad Like Me", Kingfish injects modern soul vocals with rap-inspired lyrics and gritty blues guitar. As he is exposed to temptations and bad influences, he chooses to walk right past these vices, and he becomes "bad" in reverse. Another favorite, "Nothing But Love", a modern soul ballad with

smooth vocals, shows a gentler side where he sings from his heart. He was happy and content with the single life, until love came crashing in and changed everything. On the Hendrix-inspired song, "Voodoo Charm", Kingfish unleashes some of the best blazing guitar on the album. Many of his guitar fans are going to put this song on repeat. The album ends with "Memphis", a song that is based on his Delta roots. It represents where he came from, which will always be a part of him in his evolution as a person and a musician.

"Hard Road" is an important milestone in the development of Kingfish's musical career. It shows his mastery of combining different musical influences into his own unique style that will surely leave his fans excited to see what's next. ■



## Anthony Roberts Memorial CD Fund

### Awards its First \$10,000 Grant

The Cascade Blues Association is honored to announce the winner(s) of our newest initiative that will lead to a lasting impact on our region's blues community: The Anthony Roberts Memorial CD Fund.

This fund, created through an endowment in memory of beloved community member Anthony Roberts, will award \$10,000 to help a Pacific Northwest blues artist record and release their first commercial blues CD. It's an opportunity to ensure that our region's blues talent reaches audiences far beyond our local stages.

Applications were accepted October 1st to November 12th, 2025, and were open to all CBA member musicians who live within the CBA's geographic region and have not previously released a commercial CD. A review committee of experienced CBA members carefully considered all submissions using a fair and confidential scoring system, selecting the artist who showed the greatest potential to succeed — and who will most benefit

from this pivotal step in their musical journey.

The ideal candidate has already made an impression in our blues community — through performances, participation in the Journey to Memphis competition, Muddy Award nominations and involvement with the CBA. The grant recipient was announced at the CBA Holiday Party on December 7th, 2025.

The grant winner will have 18 months to complete their debut CD, with mentorship available from the CBA throughout the process. Once the album is ready, the CBA will help promote and help host the official CD release event.

We are excited to announce the winner is Kivett Bednar! His CD will perpetuate the memory of Anthony Roberts, who's name will live on

with each album release.

As a bonus, the CBA will award \$300 to Josh Makosky to complete his first commercial Blues CD release. ■
